No to Violence is clear that family violence is most frequently used by men as a way to exercise power and control over women and children. This is due to a history of rigid gender stereotypes and unequal power structures. Gender inequity and gender inequality are at the grassroots of men's use of violence against women, and children, particularly in a family violence context.

Men's use of violence is a choice and men must take responsibility for their behaviour.

Violence against women and children is pervasive, constant and a men's issue.
